LEARNING & GROWING IN ABRAXAS GARDENS

KidsGardening Youth Garden Grantee, Abraxas Continuation High School in Poway, California transformed a neglected tennis court into a flourishing school garden. Spearheaded by teacher Bob Lutticken and dedicated colleagues, the project bloomed into an outdoor classroom brimming with life and learning.

What began as 40 raised beds and an orchard, soon evolved into a 12,000-gallon aquaponic system teeming with tilapia and yielding abundant produce. Today, the garden not only nourishes the students but also extends its bounty to local families in need.

Driven by passion and commitment, Abraxas teachers and students cultivated four thriving educational programs within the garden's embrace. Over 150 students engage in Agriculture, Aquaponics, Culinary, and Transitions programs, fostering a sense of ownership, community responsibility, and environmental stewardship.

Abraxas serves students seeking a more intimate and flexible educational environment, offering personalized, project-based learning that ignites their passions and dreams. For many, the garden becomes a sanctuary, where they find solace, purpose, and confidence amidst life's challenges.

Bob's students, inspired by their garden experiences, envision careers in horticulture and sustainability, propelled by their newfound skills and aspirations. The Transitions program empowers young adults with disabilities, cultivating valuable skills and spreading contagious joy through their accomplishments.

As the garden flourishes, so does its impact on the community. Surplus produce finds its way to local organizations, nourishing families and fostering connections. A culinary program, born from the garden's abundance, teaches students to create nutritious meals from garden-fresh ingredients, sparking pride and culinary exploration.

Beyond science and cooking, the garden serves as a hub for interdisciplinary learning, weaving art, business, and community engagement into its vibrant tapestry. Despite accolades and achievements, it's the everyday moments of learning and growth that fuel excitement for the garden's future.








New Meadowscaping Guides!

KidsGardening teamed up with our friends at American Meadows to develop two guides for educators and caregivers to celebrate and promote meadow plantings with kids. "Meadowscaping with Kids" helps educators and caregivers understand the process of meadowscaping and uplift its benefits with kids. The "Meadowscaping Makes it Better Activity Guide" provides information and inspiration for creating meadow plantings anywhere — even in containers — and features six fun, hands-on projects to delight and inform young gardeners.

Growing Food is Digital (and in Spanish)!

As part of a USDA Farm to School Implementation Grant, KidsGardening was able to fund the translation of the Growing Food curriculum into Spanish. Growing Food is now available in Spanish and English as a free digital download as part of a "Seeds of Success Toolkit". The curriculum provides a collection of 20 lesson plans with engaging experiences for students to learn science through the study of food systems and garden activities.


