In 2025, 170 programs will receive \$500 - \$1,500 in funding. The deadline for application submission is Friday, January 31, 2025, at 11:59 pm PT.

This includes the amount and purpose of the grant, any photographs you have provided, your logo or trademark, and other information and materials about your organization and its activities.
- To complete a year-end report summarizing the project promptly following the end of the
 period during which you are to use all grant funds. Your reports should describe your
 progress in achieving the purposes of the grant and include a detailed accounting of the
 use and expenditure of the grant funds.
 - To cooperate fully with KidsGardening to assure that they can satisfy all of the requirements of an "expenditure responsibility" grant following the terms of the Internal Revenue Code and the regulations thereunder.
